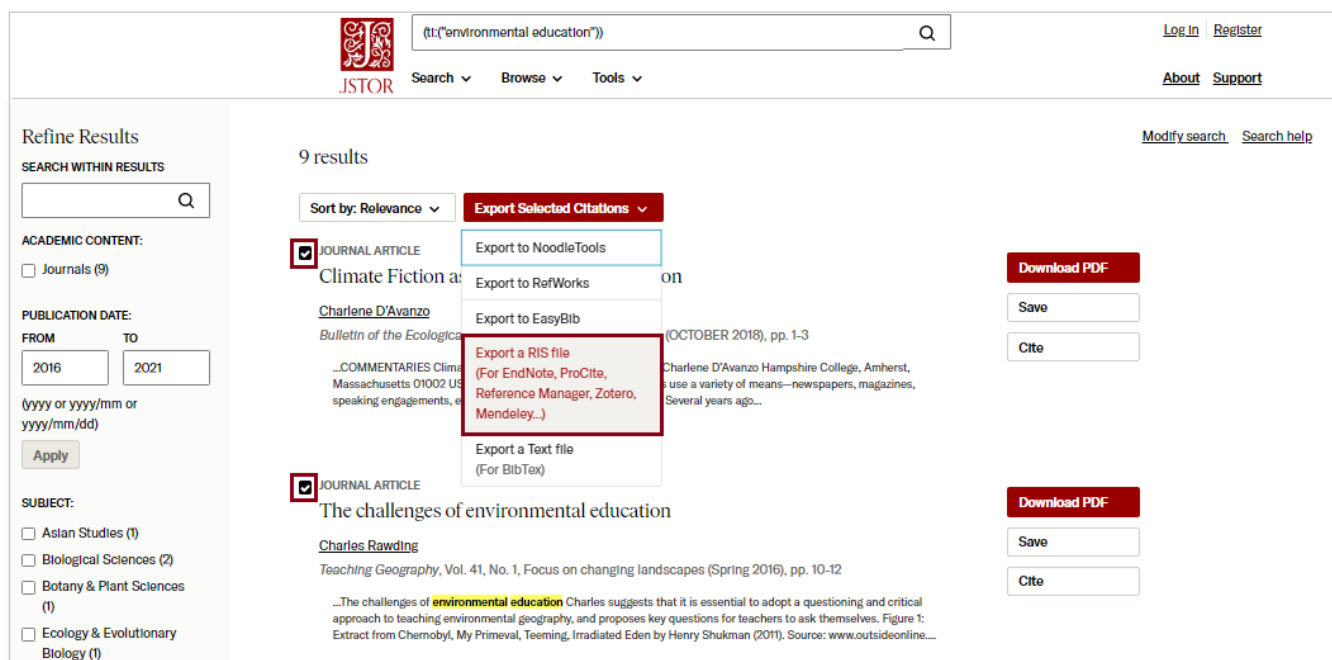


Entrada de referencias y documentos. Desde JSTOR

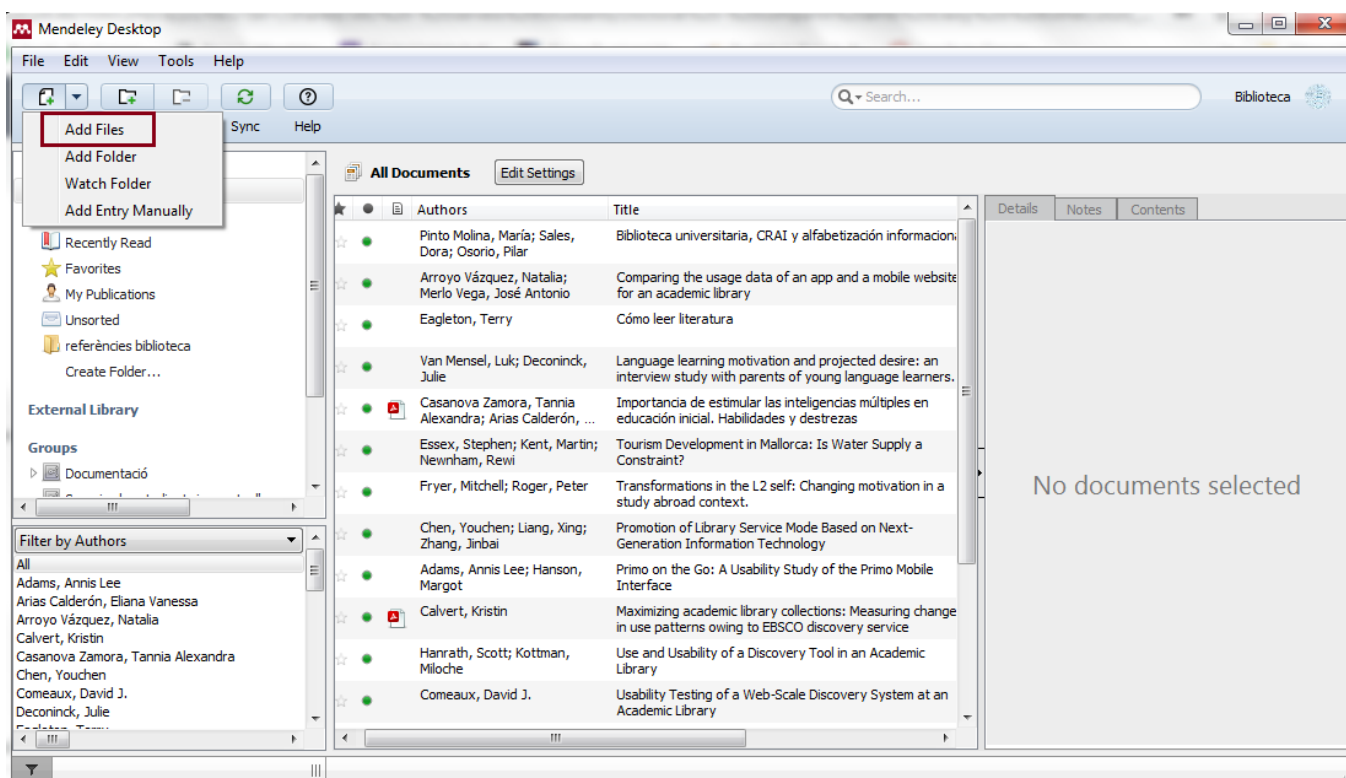
Si bien el *Web Importer* funciona para la exportación desde JSTOR, la manera más eficaz de exportar referencias a Mendeley es a través de un archivo .RIS.

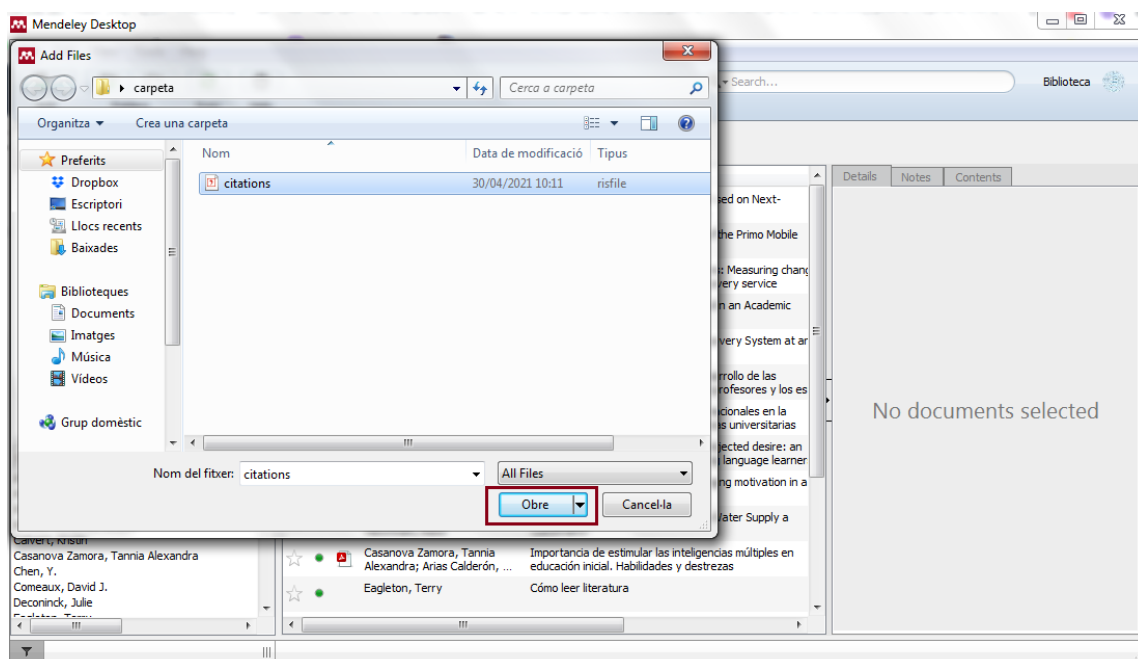
Seleccionamos los resultados de una búsqueda que queramos exportar y en el desplegable *Export Selected Citations* escogemos la opción *Export a RIS file*:
