## How to search for a book in the catalogue

You can find out whether the book you're interested in is available at the library by using the catalogue. It provides you with access to all library resources.

Each book is represented by a bibliographic reference with its identifying elements. These details will be normally arranged as follows: author, year of publication, title, place of publication and publisher.

To search for a book in the catalogue, head to the library website and type in the author and title, or the first few words if the title is a long one.
Click on the title for information about the book and how many copies are available at the library.

All you have to do is write the call number down and get the book from the matching shelf. Use the numbering on the shelves to find the call number for your book. Once you have the book, head to the counter to check it out.

The number of books you can check out and loan length vary depending on whether you are an undergrad, postgrad or PhD student, a lecturer or an external user.

Another copy of the book is held at the Son Lledó library. This library houses the UIB's Historical and Special Collections. Be aware that you cannot check books out from Son Lledó.

Another copy is held at the March library with which we have a collaboration agreement. If you are interested in this copy, please contact them directly.
